JOHN C. THOMAS

IHS Athletic Historian & Statistician

John Thomas spent his formative years in Ipswich listening to Ipswich athletic folklore. These Ipswich tales of athletic prowess on the playing fields and basketball courts inspired John to put pencil to paper and document the events of not only Ipswich past, but of Ipswich present.

As a high school student John became a football correspondent to the Boston Globe and Boston Herald. He would report the scores and highlights of local football games. At the same time, John became a radio correspondent for WESX radio. His love of sports reporting, history and statistics was just beginning.

After graduating from Ipswich High School in 1967, John matriculated at Bryant McIntosh Junior College and graduated in 1970. With his diploma secured, John joined the Ipswich High School staff as the athletic department clerk in 1971. From 1971 to 1991, John assisted Athletic Directors Elliott Roundy and Arthur Carey with the daily operations of the IHS Athletic Department.

During his tenure as the IHS Athletic Department clerk, John began compiling statistics on all Ipswich athletes. He was also the media correspondent to both local and Boston papers. In addition, John became the liaison to the Secretary/Treasurer of the Cape Ann League. Area athletic directors, reporters, college recruiters and coaches would call John if they needed information.

While working in the athletic department, John began to compile historical statistics on past Manning High and Ipswich High athletes. He has published *Manning High & Ipswich High Football From 1901–1975*. Through John's diligent research the stories of old are now being documented. Because of John's tireless efforts, many coaches and IHS athletes have received awards, honors and scholarships.

JAYNE BENIROWSKI CANTY


Basketball 1977–1979

Jayne Benirowski Canty was the most dominant and prolific player in Ipswich High School's girls' basketball history. While playing varsity Tiger basketball for just three years, Jayne amassed an amazing 1,113 points and averaged an astounding 13.2 rebounds per game. She was both feared and respected by opponents. Jayne led by example both on and off the court and was elected by her teammates as the sole Captain in her senior year.

Jayne's prowess on the basketball court earned her many awards and honors nationally, statewide and locally. Nationally, Jayne was named a Converse All-American in her senior year at Ipswich High School. State awards include the following: Boston Globe All-Scholastic (1978 & 1979); Boston Herald All-Scholastic (1978 & 1979); Salem News All Star (1977, 1978 & 1979); Beverly Times All-Star (1978 & 1979); Agganis All Star (1979); Cape Ann League All League (1978 & 1979); and, Cape Ann League All Star (1977, 1978 & 1979). Locally, Jayne received the MVP Award in both 1978 and 1979.

During the MIAA State Championship game in 1979, Jayne's on court performance and leadership skills, in a triple overtime loss, earned her a full scholarship to NCAA Division I, Providence College. While at Providence College, Jayne continued her exceptional play and leadership for four years participating in Big East play and the NCAA Tournament. She was elected Captain by her teammates in her senior year.

After graduating from Providence College Jayne worked for Acorn Computer and Kroin Inc. For the past 18 years, she has worked for General Electric in both product management and sales. Jayne is married to former PC basketball player and alumnus Sean Canty. They live in Danvers with their two children, Jaclyn, age 17, and Ryan, age 19.



RUBEN BRITT, JR.

Basketball

1968–1970

Ruben distinguished himself as one of the best basketball players in IHS history. The wiry 6'3" lefty had speed, grace and a competitive edge that marks all great players.

In his junior year, Ruben led IHS to its first state championship, scoring 539 points with 14 rebounds a game. He tipped in a teammate's missed foul shot with two seconds left to send the tournament game into overtime at Boston Garden in a game that Ipswich won. He scored the winning basket in the state finals. In his senior year, Ruben averaged more than 27 points and 18 rebounds per game, as Ipswich was undefeated in league play and Ruben was the second leading scorer in Massachusetts. Coach Dave Whipple remarked that Ruben was his most talented player:

"Ruben was one of those rare athletes who mixed power and finesse, depending upon the situation, and made all players around him better players. People forget that he was also an outstanding passer, shot blocker and led the team in steals."

Ruben was a Boston Globe, Boston Herald and Record American All-Scholastic in 1969–1970, and All League for the Beverly Times and the Salem Evening News. In only two years, without the three point line, he became the first IHS player to score 1000 points finishing with 1161 career points. His teams were 47–4 and won 33 games in a row. He was selected to play in the 1970 Capital City High School All-American game.

Ruben played at the College of Sequoias and Southern University and in two NCAA tournaments. He is a professional educator at Rowan University and the author of three (3) books. He and his wife Penny are proud parents of two children, Ruben III and Savannah.



BRETT BUDZINSKI Football, Basketball, Track 1989–1993

It would be difficult to find a better example of a three-sport student athlete than Brett Budzinski.


In football, Brett was a three year starter at quarterback where he set numerous individual records, and led the Tigers to Super Bowl victories in 1991 and 1992. Brett was named 1992 CAL Player of the Year, and all-scholastic by the Herald and Globe, the latter naming him the Division IV Player of the Year.

A four year starter in basketball, Brett received the Dudek Memorial Award as team MVP three times. All-league as a junior and CAL Player of the Year as a senior, Brett finished his career as Ipswich's all-time leading scorer with 1395 points.

As a junior in track he was the CAL and Class D 400m State Champion. As a senior, he won the 200m and 400m in the CAL league meet, setting a meet and school records in each, and completed his Player of the Year trifecta with the CAL MVP award. He went on to win both the Class D and the All Class State Meets in the 400m, resulting in his selection to the Globe and Herald All Scholastic teams.

Brett was a member of the National Honor Society, and was named Moynihan Lumber North Shore Student Athlete of the Year and the Globe's Male Athlete of the Year.

Brett continued his football and track careers at Princeton University. A 2002 graduate of Boston University Law School, Brett currently works in Boston for Wilmer, Cutler, Pickering, Hale and Dorr. He and his wife Lindsay keep busy with twins, Robert and Anya, and their younger sister Ela.



JOHN LOUIS "BUBBA" GALANIS

Football 1968–1972

John "Bubba" Galanis, IHS Class of 1972, was a three sport letterman who played football, basketball and lacrosse. He was captain of the football team and co-captain of the basketball team his senior year. His most notable accomplishments were earned as a two-way tackle on the Tiger football team. The football team lost only two games in the four years he played. He was awarded the Gillette Right Guard Lineman of the Year award. This award was established by the Gillette Company and Letterman magazine to honor the "unsung heroes" of football – the linemen – on the high school level. He was also a Boston Globe All-Scholastic, Boston Herald Traveler All-Scholastic, Harry Agganis All-Star, All-North Shore football team and Cape Ann League All-Star.

He was recruited by several Division 1 colleges including: Notre Dame, USC, Wake Forest, Miami, Syracuse and Boston College. He chose to attend the University of Notre Dame. He played for the Fighting Irish team that competed in the Orange Bowl in 1972 and 1974. Two of his most memorable college football experiences were the Notre Dame victory against Alabama in the Sugar Bowl in 1973 to win the National Championship and playing at Schaefer Stadium in Foxboro against Boston College in his senior year. He graduated from Notre Dame, Class of 1976, with a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration.

John was greatly influenced throughout his football career by the legendary coaches for whom he played: Jack Welch of Ipswich High School and Ara Parseghian from the University of Notre Dame. He has been a life-long resident of Ipswich and avid supporter of Ipswich High School athletics. In recent years he has volunteered his time to assist the IHS football coaching staff.



EDWARD (MACHAJ) MACKEY


Baseball, Basketball 1938–1941

Edward (Machaj) Mackey graduated from Ipswich High School in 1941, making significant athletic contributions in Ipswich and beyond. He was one of nine children born in Ipswich to immigrant parents from Poland. He enjoyed a long successful athletic career, despite overcoming rheumatic fever as a child. His athletic skills were cultivated at Ipswich High School where he entered school younger and less experienced.

Ed Mackey had "natural" talent and he developed into an outstanding pitcher and basketball player at Ipswich High School. With the support of his coaches and teammates, Mackey took each opportunity to reach for success for his team. The baseball team won the Cape Ann League Championship three years in a row, retiring the trophy in Ipswich. The basketball team tied for the championship in 1941 and Mackey was the leading scorer.

Mackey was recruited to Phillips Academy in Andover to pitch. He excelled, even winning the Andover/Exeter game in 1942. From there, he was recruited to Yale University, as their "Ace pitcher" and captain of the team. Winning 18 games during his varsity career, Mackey was regarded as "one of the leading collegiate pitchers in the country" receiving offers from three major league baseball teams. In 1945 he signed with the New York Yankees organization and played with the Newark Bears. He returned to Ipswich to pursue a career in Engineering and he continued to play baseball with the Ipswich Chiefs. With his "blazing fast ball and magnificent control pitching," his team went all the way to the National Baseball Congress Tournament Championship after winning the County, State, and Regional Championships in 1948.

Ed Mackey was a team leader, highly regarded for his sportsmanship, and yet a humble athlete; he would share the honor of each victory with his coaches and teammates.



JO JO ROBISHAW
Football
1937–1939

Born Philip Lester Robishaw on March 1, 1920, "Jo Jo" Robishaw was one of the greatest football players to ever play for Ipswich High School. At 5'4" and 135 pounds he was greased lightning on the gridiron in leading Ipswich to consecutive State Class D championships in 1938 and 1939. He was known as a triple threat as he did the kicking and passing in addition to his running. Jo Jo also starred in baseball at the High School.

Jo Jo's high school football career started in 1937 when he made the varsity football team as a freshman, a rare accomplishment in those days, under the watchful eye of Massachusetts Hall of Fame Coach Robert Conary. He had 13 carries for 246 yards (19 yards per carry) and four touchdowns that season. In 1938 as a sophomore he scored 105 of the team's 255 points and had 1,635 total yards from scrimmage.

In 1939 the Tigers went undefeated and untied winning the State Class D title again with a 9–0 record. The signature game that season was the Haverhill game. Back in 1939 Haverhill was a state powerhouse in Class A. The game was played at Haverhill stadium in scorching heat. Jo Jo scored the only touchdown of the game as Ipswich defeated Haverhill 7–0. That season Jo Jo scored 21 touchdowns and ran for 1,133 yards. His career point total of 270 ranks him amongst the most in Ipswich history. Jo Jo became the first Ipswich and Class D player to be voted to the All-Scholastic Team in 1939 and is the only Ipswich player ever to be named captain of the All-Scholastic Team.

In July 1942, Jo Jo married the former Barbara McCormack and raised a family. He went into the Navy in October 1942 until he was discharged in November 1945. He also served in the Naval Reserves from 1947 through 1951. During his military service, he was awarded many medals including two bronze stars. Jo Jo Robishaw passed away at the age of 74 in 1994.



DR. ANN "KIKI" PAPAGIOTAS

Basketball Coach

1970–1984

For twelve years, 1973–1984, Dr. Ann "Kiki" Papagiotas served as head girls' basketball coach at Ipswich High School where her teams amassed an amazing 209–37 record. Her 85% winning percentage has yet to be surpassed by any coach at Ipswich High School. During her tenure Kiki's teams won a combined ten Cape Ann League Championships. Her teams also won a combined six MIAA Division II/III North Championships. During the 1979-1980 season, her team captured the MIAA State Championship in Division III.

Many awards and recognitions have been presented to Kiki during her tenure as girls' basketball coach: Boston Globe Coach of the Year (1980 & 1984); Salem Evening News Coach of the Year (1977, 1980 & 1984); MBCA Coach of the Year; MBCA 200 Victories Award; Agganis All-Star Coach; Cape Ann League Coach of the Year; and Bay State Games gold and silver medal coach. Kiki was also inducted into the New Agenda: Northeast Women's Hall of Fame in 1996 and the Massachusetts Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1997.

Dr. Papagiotas also has three publications to her credit: *Pride Is the Key to Success* and *Breaking the Press Without Guards* were published by Prentice Hall Coaches Clinic. Her article *Where Have All The Coaches (Women) Gone*, appeared in the Journal of Massachusetts Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance.

From 1985–1987, Kiki served as the Assistant Coach of women's basketball at Bentley University where she served as the head recruiter for the Falcon's NCAA Division II program. After leaving Bentley University, Dr. Papagiotas embarked on a successful public school administrative career, retiring in June of 2006. She is currently an educational consultant.



C. ELLIOTT ROUNDY
Athletic Director/Coach
1950-1982


Elliott Roundy attended Marblehead High from 1932 through 1935 where he excelled in both football and baseball. Upon graduation he attended Hampton Prep in 1936, and then on to Colgate University. While at Colgate he continued his football career and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in 1940.

Elliott served in the US Navy during World War II and was involved in the invasions from North Africa to Normandy in the amphibious forces. As a Lieutenant (S.G.), he commanded an L.C.T. from 1942 until his discharge in 1946.

His career at Ipswich High School began in 1950 as a teacher and the athletic director. In 1951 Roundy became the head football coach and held the position for the next thirteen years. His tenure as the Ipswich football coach produced two Class D Championships in 1953 and 1954 and an undefeated team in 1959. Coach Roundy, as he became known to everyone in Ipswich, retired from coaching in 1963 with an overall record of 64 wins, 40 loses and 2 ties.

Coach Roundy became the full time Athletic Director in 1964 where his first job was to hire a young assistant coach from Newburyport named Jack Welch and as they say, "the rest is history." His next task was to assist in the formation of the Cape Ann Football League Conference which consisted of schools from the Cape Ann and North Shore areas. Shortly after the inaugural season Coach Roundy took the helm as its Commissioner in 1970 and held the position until his retirement in 1982.

Prior to his passing many honors were bestowed on Elliott Roundy. He was inducted into the Massachusetts High School State Coaches Hall of Fame in 1979 and the Marblehead Magicians Gridiron Club Hall of Fame Class of '35 in 1998. But his greatest and most fitting honors were having the historic Seaside Park Grandstands in Marblehead, which he helped to restore, and the Ipswich High School Gymnasium named in his honor. He truly was a man with two hometowns.



JACK WELCH Football Coach 1964–2000

Jack Welch was a teacher and coach in the Ipswich Schools for 46 years (1964–2010). Coach Welch led the Ipswich Tigers football team to 5 State Championships and 8 Cape Ann League titles. He was honored as the Coach of the Year on 6 different occasions and was inducted into the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame in 1995. Coach Welch also received the Elliot Roundy Distinguished Service Award in 2001. Upon his retirement he was one of the most respected and successful coaches in New England, with an overall record of 224 wins, 132 losses and 6 ties. Jack was recently named the second greatest football coach on the North Shore by the Salem News.

Jack is a native of Newburyport, Massachusetts where he graduated from Immaculate Conception High School. He began a professional baseball career with a minor league team in the Boston Braves organization soon after graduation but that came to an abrupt halt when he enlisted in the United States Navy during the Korean War. Jack served as one of the first U.S. Navy Seals. This experience further developed his values of family, teamwork, dedication and sacrifice. After the service Jack attended and graduated from the University of Maine where he played football and was elected captain his senior year. Jack returned to his hometown with his wife Sandy where they raised their family.

Coach Welch was known and respected for his hard-nosed, disciplined and well-conditioned teams. They were taught to believe in themselves and in each other. He set a strong example for his players always putting family and team first. His competitiveness and passion for coaching and teaching football and his knowledge of the game are legendary. Coach Welch always believed in "Playing to Win."

RULES FOR NOMINATIONS AND ELIGIBILTY ARE ON THE BACK PAGE

The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — **ATHLETES:** To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — *COACHES:* To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria: They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — *MERITORIOUS SERVICE:* To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
