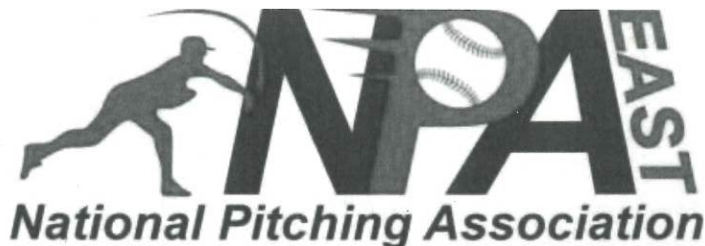

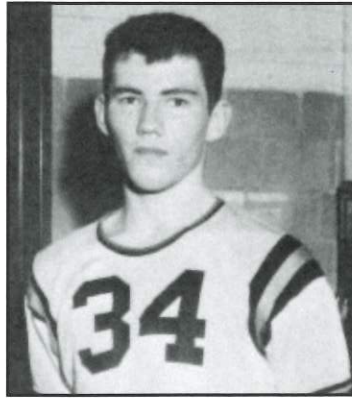
PETER ADAMOWICZ

Basketball, Baseball, Track
1962-1966

Peter Adamowicz was the best male athlete in the Class of 1966. He was not the biggest in stature, but certainly the fastest and one of the strongest athletes at I.H.S. at this time. Pete displayed his athletic prowess for 3 seasons on the I.H.S. basketball court as a backcourt player during his sophomore season and as a starter at guard for 2 seasons. Pete also displayed his athletic excellence as a third baseman, holding down the hot corner position for 3 seasons. His coach, I.H.S. Hall of Famer, Bob Burke, credited Pete not only for his great fielding ability, but also for his pin-point throwing accuracy at third.

During the 1965-66 basketball season, Pete was part of a speedy backcourt with fellow senior, Skip Cressy. Pete averaged 18 points per game that included a 4-game run of 27, 28, 32 and 34 points without the benefit of the 3-point line. Pete and his fellow seniors led the team to 13-5 record and a berth in the Tech Tourney. Pete was named to the Cape Ann League All Star Team for the 1965-66 season.

Pete also displayed his great athletic capabilities by setting the then season record for the 50-yard dash at 5.4 seconds and recording the highest school-wide fitness scores as measured by the National AAHPER Test administered by Coach Bob Burke. He was also selected as Best Male Athlete by his classmates in the Class of 1966.



HENRY COWLES

Basketball, Baseball

1959-1963

Henry Cowles was a key player for the I.H.S. Basketball Team for the Cape Ann League 1962-63 Season. This team qualified for the Tech Tourney with a 12-6 record keyed by an 8-game winning season to gain entry.

The larger story of Henry, though, was his commitment to his own basketball development. Henry credits his grandfather, Henry Thomas Cowles, for beginning his development by fixing an old table top to a light pole across the street from his home. That is where Henry's sports development began. Henry earned Varsity Letters during his Junior season when he averaged 10 points per game to help his team to a 9-7 season. Then came that great 1962-63 season. The team began with a 4-3 record. Henry then injured an ankle and sat out 3 games, all losses, dropping the team to a 4-6 record. A .667 record had to be achieved in order to qualify for the post-season Tech Tourney. The Tigers needed to win the remaining games on their schedule to reach a 12-6 record. Spurred on by Henry's scoring prowess, the team won 8 straight games to qualify. Henry became the leading CAL scorer with 322 points.

In tournament play, Henry scored a total of 80 points. He netted 22 against Dennis-Yarmouth and 38 against Marshfield in each of those wins. The season ended with a 47-46 loss to Hanover on a buzzer-beating long shot. Henry scored 20 points in that game. Henry went on to post-grad play at Phillips Exeter Academy.



JOHN J. HOPPING

Soccer, Baseball

1974-1978

John is the youngest of five Hopping boys that excelled in baseball at Ipswich High School. His dedication, tenacity, and commitment to the game while at IHS resulted in, along with his many awards, him being the only non-North Reading player to be invited to participate in Frank Carey's acclaimed winter baseball camp. In his Senior year, he was a member of the 1978 North Sectional Champion baseball squad. During that year, he pitched and played shortstop. He led the team in hitting during the regular season with a sizzling .463 batting average and followed up with a .451 average in the play-offs. As a pitcher, John compiled a 9-2 record with a 1.43 earned run average. He was named to the Cape Ann League All-League team following his remarkable Senior season.

John was recruited by colleges from Maine to Florida to play baseball. He accepted a scholarship to play at Husson University in Bangor, Maine. At Husson, he was named Captain during his Junior and Senior Years. He led his college team in hitting during his Sophomore season. He also became the number two starter in the pitching rotation during his Freshman and Sophomore years. Unfortunately, a shoulder injury in his Junior year relegated John to playing second base for his remaining two years at Husson.

John was also an accomplished varsity soccer player during his Junior and Senior years at IHS under coach Rick Storer. He was elected Captain in his Senior season and he was named to the Cape Ann League All-League team.

John just completed his 40th year of coaching at various levels. His many years of devoted service to Stratham, New Hampshire's Youth Baseball Program culminated in a dugout being named for him at that town's athletic fields complex. He has coached at the collegiate level for 7 years, 2 as Head Coach, guiding the University of New Hampshire Wildcats against competition throughout New England. He was named Coach of the Year in his first year as Head Coach.

Today, John's passion for the game and thrill of coaching young players finds him still actively involved in the Norman Hopping Baseball School in Ipswich. The camp is named in memory of John's late father, one of the founders of Little League in Ipswich. John is certainly doing his part to keep the Hopping name synonymous with baseball in Ipswich.



HARRY LAMPROPOULOS

Meritorious

Ipswich High School Class of 1977

The name Harry Lampropoulos conjures up many thoughts in Clam Towners' minds: Local seafood and ice cream merchant (Tigers win, free DQ); Selectman; Linebrook Playground legend. (Did he ever lose at knock hockey?); and, cribbage aficionado. The guy who knows everyone and is the unofficial "Mayor" of Ipswich. But some don't know what Harry does for the local community, and in many cases, the Ipswich sports community.

A golf game between Harry and a former bank president sowed the seeds for the Veterans' Soccer Fields at Mile Lane. Sub varsity sports were threatened? He formed the Friends of Ipswich Athletics (although he says he couldn't do it without the help of treasurer, Tony Yemma). Need to raise a few bucks for the high school basketball teams? The 50/50 raffle is born as well as the Girls' Basketball team's annual Christmas Tournament. Harry was instrumental in all of these initiatives.

If Harry is involved in a fund-raising golf tournament, he will be responsible for most, if not all, of the sponsorships. Need a ticket sold? Harry is your man. He claims to be second only to the late, great Tommy Markos when it comes to selling tickets.

Even the youth level sports have benefited from Harry's efforts. When he coached the Ipswich contingent in the District 15 Little League championships, the games came second. First, was the tournament's mission to raise money for the Jimmy Fund. Harry's team set an all-time fund-raising record for the district that stands today.

A very good athlete, Harry starred in baseball and basketball at Ipswich High. His other claim: the second best Greek point guard behind Danny Alexson!

Most importantly, Harry contributed to the community, along with his wife Kathy (Sklarz), by raising two boys, James and Al, both excellent athletes as well, who attended Ipswich schools. He is also the proud Papou, of James' daughter, Harper.



MICHAEL MARINI

Football, Basketball, Baseball
1993-1997

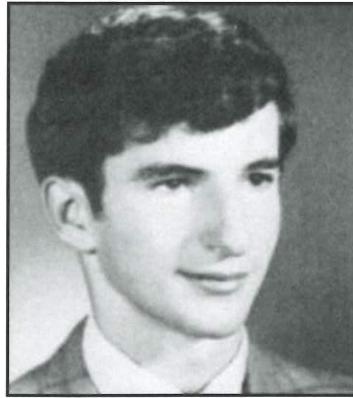
Michael was a natural athlete with a passion for sports. His work ethic helped him maximize his success and led him to an outstanding career as a three - sport athlete at Ipswich High School. He led by example and his competitiveness and positive attitude was contagious, motivating everyone around him.

After a dominant freshman football season Michael suffered a neck injury and had to sit-out his sophomore year. He came to football camp in 1996 determined to contribute and quickly earned the starting running back position. He became a member of (EMT) Evan, Mike, and Tim which was the Delaware Wing-Ts three-headed back field. Behind a dominant offensive line, they would go on to terrorize the Cape Ann league.

During his junior year Michael had a career game against Masconomet where he intercepted three passes and broke the school single game rushing record of over 200 yards. Later that season, he would join the elite few by rushing for over 1000 yards in a single season. In Michael's senior year he was selected to play in the Agganis All-Star Game.

Michael's first love was baseball. That passion would drive him to help lead the Tigers to two CAL Championship seasons. He took over the starting shortstop position as a freshman and would hold down the middle of the diamond until he graduated in 1997. In 1996, Michael would lead the CAL in slugging percentage and would end the season with the 2nd best batting average in the state. Also in 1996, Michael earned the honor of CAL "Player of the Year." In 1996 and 1997, he was selected to represent Eastern Mass in the Baystate Games.

After graduating from HIS, Michael decided to leave sports behind to attend the University of Delaware to focus on his other passion, agriculture. At Delaware he met his future wife Kimberly. Michael graduated with a degree in Marketing and Agricultural Business. Today, he runs the family farm with his wife and three children, Madelyn, Brayden and Matthew.



GARY SINCLAIR

Football, Basketball, Baseball
1967-1971

Gary Sinclair was an exceptional three sport athlete at Ipswich High School, lettering in football, basketball and baseball.

Gary played varsity football his junior and senior years, both of which saw the Tigers go undefeated. He was the starting quarterback and punter. Despite going undefeated during the 1970 season, the Tigers lost out on a third consecutive State Class D title to Amesbury on a technicality (the Tigers defeated Amesbury 12-0 that year).

Gary played varsity basketball his junior and senior years and was co-captain of the basketball team his senior year. The Tigers won an unprecedented third straight Cape Ann League championship in 1971, Gary's senior year.

Gary played varsity baseball for four years and was co-captain of the team his senior year. In one of his memorable pitching performances he hurled a no-hit, no run game through eight innings against the Manchester Hornets, striking out 18. He received the Eagle Tribune Award his senior year as the All-Around Athlete of the year. He was a Cape Ann League All-Star his senior year.

Gary continued his baseball career at Bates College in Maine. His accomplishments included being the winning pitcher in games against the eventual national champion (Maine) and other major college programs. He was selected as an All-Star in the League his senior year.

Despite a somewhat choppy start to the season they managed to win their first 4 games before falling to Rockport by 1 point. They won 5 of the next 6 games and at 9-2 were tied for the league lead with North Reading and Rockport. The Tigers rolled off seven straight wins to finish the season 16-2. The Tigers won the final regular season games by margins of 45, 32, 34 and 33 points. They were ready for the Tournament.

In game 1 of the Tech Tourney they beat St. Patrick's of Watertown, 86-53. It was onto West Brockton to play #2 seed Holbrook. Let by Britt's 24, Tommy Stamatakos's 21 and Alexson's 20, the Tigers prevailed 87-82. The rest of the games would be at the Garden. Get those fan's buses started.

The first game at the Garden was a rematch vs North Reading who had upset #1 seed Dover-Sherborn. The Tigers came out on top 66-62 in a game remembered by a late game blocked shot and basket by Tobie Goff.

Next up for the Eastern Mass final was Acton-Boxborough. The Tigers won 63-62 in double OT. The game was sent to OT by a tip in of a missed foul shot by Ruben. In the first OT Ruben and Dennis fouled out. Down 56-54 with seconds remaining, Paul Messelaar made two free throws to send it to double overtime. Huge baskets by Stamatakos and Lou Lampson down the stretch put Ipswich up 60-58. Up 61-60, Messelaar again hits two free throws for an eventual 63-62 victory.

Next up was Western Mass Champ Mt Greylock who the Tigers dispatched 79-60.

The final was vs St Stephens of Worcester with another thrilling OT victory, 65-64. Ruben had 24 and Danny 20. The final play of the game was a steal of an inbounds play at half court by Tommy Stamatakos.



GIRLS' BASKETBALL TEAM

Division IV State Champions

1994-1995

An experience like this usually begins with the words "Once Upon a Time" the Girls' Varsity Basketball Team (15-6) won the Division IV State Basketball Championship with a 59-36 victory over Hull High School at a packed house at U Mass Boston's Clark Athletic Center!

The Tigers were led by Senior Co-Captains Lindsay Gaskins and Carrie Pollack, both four- year players. Lindsay and Carrie captained a true "team effort" that went only as far as their captains would carry them. The regular season saw the Tigers lose the league title to Lynnfield by two free throws in the final seconds of the game. In North Sectional Tournament play, the Tigers eked out a victory over Tyngsboro (39-36) and overwhelmed Trinity Catholic (71-33). In the final Title game, the Tigers soundly defeated St. Mary's of Lynn (59-38) for the State Championship at Tufts University.

The Ipswich Board of Selectmen presented the team with a proclamation declaring March 20-26, as the Ipswich High School Girls' Basketball Division IV State Championship Week. The proclamation cited the Team's "true teamwork" and never allowing an opponent to score more than 40 points per game throughout tournament play. Congressman Peter Torkildsen and Senator Bruce Tarr invited the Champions to the State House to receive Proclamations of Achievement.

Throughout the season, the Tigers received tremendous support during their journey from family, classmates, friends, other IHS sports teams and the community. Many of the local businesses demonstrated their support by providing State Championship jackets to all of the team members. The fairy tale season was capped by the legendary fire engine ride through downtown Ipswich.

The 1994-1995 team was coached by Coach of the Year Holly Foster and assisted by Judd Daley. Jayne Viladenis also assisted at the State Championship game.

RULES FOR NOMINATIONS AND ELIGIBILITY ARE ON THE BACK PAGE

The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — *ATHLETES:* To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — *COACHES:* To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria: They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — *MERITORIOUS SERVICE:* To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
