KRISTINE DICICCO BOWEN

Field Hockey, Basketball, Softball
1979-1983

Kristine diCicco Bowen was an outstanding three sport athlete.

Kristine played varsity level field hockey her junior and senior year. In her junior year she was awarded the Most Improved Player. Her senior year she was named Co-Captain and MVP, was named Cape Ann All-League, Salem News All-star and lead her team to win the Cape Ann Division championship.

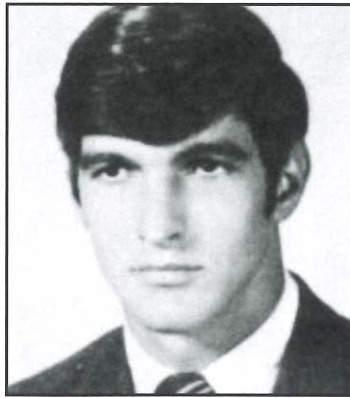
Kristine played varsity basketball her junior and senior years. Both teams won Cape Ann Championships. Senior year she was named Cape Ann League All-star, Salem News/Beverly Times All-star (honorable mention) and Most Improved Player.

Kristine played varsity softball her sophomore, junior and senior years. All three teams were Cape Ann Champions. Her senior year she was voted team Captain and MVP, and was named Cape Ann All-League, Salem News/Beverly Times All-Star.

Kristine is the only female athlete in Ipswich High School history to play on 3 Cape Ann Championship teams in the same year. In 1983, she was voted by her class as Co-Best Female Athlete.

After high school, Kristine attended Saint Michael's College in Vermont. She played varsity field hockey and was awarded the Most Improved Player in her sophomore year. In 1992. She was the USTF Tae Kwon Do New England Grand Champion in women's black belt competition. She coached youth sports for many years and picked up playing soccer in her early 40s, which she enjoys playing to this day.

Kristine currently lives in Ipswich with her husband Bob. They raised four children together and are blessed with three wonderful grandchildren.



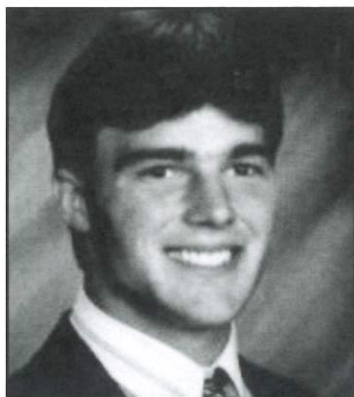
DAVID DOYON
Football, Track, Lacrosse
1964-1968

David Doyon had a passion and dedication to his craft, whether it was in track where he excelled in many events, or in lacrosse where he played on the first interscholastic team during his sophomore year. Although David excelled in both track and lacrosse, it was playing football for the Tigers in which he truly took his performance to a higher level.

David is first to credit the “amazing coaching staff” when discussing his exploits on the football field. Coaches Welch, Roundy, Carey, Dembowski, Spellman and Perna (all HOF members) pushed David to be the best he could be in sport. David also points out that it was the comradery of both teammates and coaches that allowed the teams to perform like “well-oiled machines.” Between great coaching, teamwork and his own above average athletic ability, David earned many honors and awards in football. His football honors include: All-League/All-Star in '67 & '68; AHEPA MVP Award in '68; Herald Traveler All-Star in '68; CAL MVP in '68; Harry Agganis All-Star starter in '68; and Captain in '68. In addition, David scored 112 points in nine games in '68 and captained the 1968 Class D title team.

Much of David's successes came during his junior and senior years. His motivation to excel escalated during '67 & '68 due in part to the death of his older brother, Lance Corporal Paul F. Doyon (IHS '66), in 1967 while serving his country in Vietnam. David would always think of Paul during his games and events.

After graduation from Ipswich High School, David went into the family business of carpentry. He built many homes in the Ipswich area. David is married to Georgette Bullock. They have two sons and two granddaughters. Dave and Georgette now reside full-time in Florida.



MARC GREENLEAF

Lacrosse, Football, Hockey
1989-1993

Marc was an outstanding three sport athlete at Ipswich High School lettering in lacrosse, football and hockey.

In the tough Eastern division of lacrosse [before the CAL], Ipswich was a small school amongst much larger opponents. Marc was a three year starter as a midfielder who has been described as an “explosive player” and a “blockbuster scorer” who “wants the ball in close games.” He has scored as many as seven goals in a key game – five coming in the fourth quarter. As a junior, he was an Eastern Mass All-Star and finished the season with 46 goals and 7 assists. As a senior, he was elected captain, selected a Salem News All-Star, named a Globe All-Scholastic, and voted Eastern Conference Player of the year by opposing coaches even though he missed three games with a dislocated shoulder.

As a senior, Marc was a running back and kicker for the football team along with another Hall of Famer, Brett Budzinski. He was a consistent scorer and instrumental in the Tigers Super Bowl season of 1992. Marc helped the team win the CAL title with hard work and determination heading into the Super Bowl game. Hull and Ipswich had identical 9-1 records. Marc scored 2 touchdowns in the first half and started off the second half with a 72 yard kick-off return for touchdown #3. In the final minutes of the game when the Hull QB was sacked, Marc recovered the fumble and time ran out. Final score 44-33 and Ipswich had won its second Super Bowl title in two years.

Marc was a 4 year Varsity hockey player, who adjusted quickly to playing at the varsity level and had tremendous motivation to put the puck in the net. He was a consistent goal scorer and team player.

Marc lives in Ipswich, has 4 children and works as the lead carpenter for Jason Kamps Builders.



JANICE KNOWLES

Softball, Basketball, Tennis, Archery
1953-1957

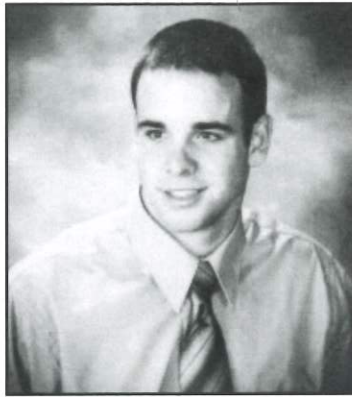
Janice's high school athletic career started formally in the eighth grade, having played basketball for the high school team. It continued on for four years in high school. Jan's perseverance and tenacity at her Varsity guard position was suspected to be one "hard to fill" after her graduation.

Following the basketball season, Jan, a southpaw, took to the Varsity Softball field, pitching and playing first base for four years. In the interim, she engaged in tennis during her freshman, sophomore and senior years, as well as archery her senior year.

Janice's dedication to sport was recognized early on by her mentor and coach, I.H.S. Hall of Fame teacher and coach, Frances Cogswell. As fellow inductee Marlene Super Smith before her, Jan served as an assistant to Coach Cogswell, due to her athletic prowess. She, too, shared the yearbook quote of "To love the game beyond the prize." It was also Jan's outstanding athletic ability that earned her the title of Class Girl Athlete for the graduating class of 1957.

Practicing in her professional life what she learned in her athletic career, Janice proved to be an invaluable employee, serving as the bookkeeper at Bernard's Jewelers in Salem for forty-six years after her graduation from Burdett College. Ray Tetrault, an owner of Bernard's, describes Jan as a dedicated, loyal, trusted and principled employee. These are all attributes of a great athlete.

Growing up, Jan was an inspiration to her younger sister, "Ellie," popular Ipswich teacher and coach. Thus, it is with enormous pride and joy that Eleanor Knowles welcomes her beloved sister and mentor, the late Janice Knowles, to join her as a well-deserved member of the Ipswich High School Athletic Hall of Fame.



STEVEN PHANEUF

Football, Basketball, Track
2003-2007

Steve Phaneuf was a three- sport athlete at Ipswich High school lettering in Football, Basketball, and Track for four years, following in his family's athletic footsteps. His father, Mark, and uncles Brian and Jeff were also well-known Tigers. Brian Phaneuf was inducted into Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame in 2017.

In his Senior year, Steve and his football team finished the season as division 3A Super Bowl Champions. Coached by Ted Flaherty, Steve scored 29 touchdowns during the Super Bowl season and set a new school record with 176 points, previously held by Hall of Fame legend Bernie Adell's 164 points. As Ted Flaherty said, "You're lucky if you get a kid like Steve every 20 years. He's just a joy to coach." The '06 Tigers set a school record with 7 shutouts and were a defensive nightmare for opponents. Steve was named Boston Herald Division 3A Player of the Year and earned Boston Globe and Boston Herald All-Scholastic honors that year.

Shortly after dunking a basketball in 8th grade, Steve earned the nickname "Freak" that reverberated throughout gymnasiums across the North Shore. He charged up the crowds and his teammates with powerful slam dunks, emphatic blocked shots and acrobatic finishes. The Tigers played to sold out crowds and the "Tiger Den" was established. Coached by one of Ipswich Basketball's greats, Doug Woodworth, Steve helped his team win four straight Cape Ann League titles, competed in two State Finals at the TD Garden, and won the 2005 Division IV State Championship. He finished his basketball career as an All-Scholastic, scoring over 1,000 career points.

Coached by Ipswich Athletic Hall of Famer Ken Spellman, Steve was a standout in track & field. He competed in the 100, 200 and 400- yard dash, the 4x100 long jump, triple jump and high jump. Qualifying for states in all four years, Steve was an All-League selection and went on to receive the Cape Ann League Performer of the Year award. Steve stated, "I was very fortunate to have a coach like Ken Spellman who helped me understand the power of hard work and a positive mind set."



MARLENE SUPER SMITH

Basketball, Softball, Field Hockey, Archery, Running
1945-1949

Marlene Super Smith was, well, super at basketball, the only interscholastic sport available at the time at IHS. Long before Title IX was enacted, when recordkeeping was sparse for women, Ipswich girls were, nevertheless, being acknowledged for their athletic achievements on a local and regional level. Marlene was recognized as her team's center-forward and high scorer her junior and senior years, averaging 15 points per game. During her senior year, which she co-captained, she was responsible for scoring 123 points of the 201 team total. She once scored 32 points in one game, the highest in Essex County at that time. During her three years playing Varsity basketball, she led the team to an 18-3 record and has fond memories of traveling out of town to games, notably playing on the school stage in Rockport, in great comparison even to the shortened court at what was then Ipswich High School.

Her Henry Newbolt yearbook quote, "To love the game beyond the prize," aptly applies to Marlene. She made her athletic mark under the auspices of former teacher and girls' coach, Frances Cogswell, also an esteemed member of the Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame. Inspired by Coach Cogswell, Marlene assisted with coaching and teaching "gym" classes, simply for pure enjoyment. Upon graduation, she set aside her desire to follow in Ms. Cogswell's footsteps to become a physical education teacher. Instead she studied nursing. Athletic scholarships were not available for young women.

Although basketball was her sport of choice, she enjoyed participating in everything available to girls in the mid- to late '40s in high school, such as softball, field hockey, archery, and running, that were considered Girls' Exhibition sports. She was recognized as being the Girls' Athlete for the Class of 1949.

Marlene now makes her home in Howell, Michigan, with her husband Kenneth. Her children and grandchildren live nearby. She is honored to see her athletic achievements and love of sports come full circle by being inducted into Ipswich High School Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2018.



BARBARA WAITE TILTON

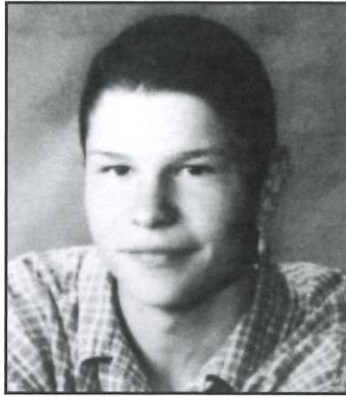
Basketball, Softball, Running

1934-1938

Barbara Waite Tilton was a woman ahead of the times. Her drive and dedication to the promotion of girls' sports at Ipswich High School occurred thirty-eight years before the enactment of Title IX! In the 1930's, there were no interscholastic sports for girls. Barbara took it upon herself to organize and head the Girls' Sports Committee whose task it was to create athletic opportunities for girls at Ipswich High School. The Girls' Sports Committee championed the creation of a strong intramural girls' program that was the precursor of the highly competitive "Girls' Exhibitions" of the 1940's.

In addition to promoting girls' sports, Barbara was an excellent athlete. She participated in basketball, softball and running during her four years at Ipswich High School. Because of her athletic ability and participation in sports, Barbara was voted "Best Athlete" by her classmates in her senior year. She was the epitome of the dedicated athlete.

After graduation from Ipswich High School, Barbara attended and received her RN from New York Presbyterian Hospital School of Nursing. In 1942, she married Kendall Tilton (IHS Class of 1935), and moved around the country due to Kendall's work. During their travels, Barbara raised their four children, always promoting their participation in sports. In her later years, Barbara did volunteer work in Indiana and was a member of the Senior Center. While in Indiana, Barbara both watched and encouraged her grandchildren and great grandchildren play sports.



DUSTIN ZABELSKI

Lacrosse, Football
1998-2002

Dustin Zabelski had an outstanding career as a lacrosse player at Ipswich High School. He had a unique skill set which allowed him to score from inside or out and the field of vision to pick apart an opponent's defense. He was a three year varsity starter for the Tigers, and by the time he graduated he had broken the school's single season goals, points and career scoring records.

Dustin was an important part of the Tiger's offense in his sophomore and junior years, scoring goals in key situations, helping send the Tigers to back to back state semi-finals. He also lettered in football his junior year, before making the decision to solely focus on lacrosse.

In his senior year he played indoor lacrosse during the fall and winter, which would set him up for the most memorable season a player at Ipswich has ever had. He led the team to a record of 16-3, where he had games of 14 and 12 points and averaged 5 goals and 2 assists a game. The Tigers made it to the state finals, where they would eventually lose to Hingham. Dustin finished the season with 92 goals and 40 assists (132 points), breaking both the single season goal and points records at Ipswich. He was selected as an All-American, Boston Globe and Herald All-Scholastic, Cape Ann League All Star, team MVP and played in the North vs. South All-Star game. At the time of his graduation from Ipswich High School, he had amassed 231 points (149g, 82a), which at the time was also a school record.

Dustin finished his storied lacrosse career in 2003 at Howard Community College in Columbia, Maryland, where he led the Dragons in scoring with 56 points (33g, 23a). He was named team MVP, and was selected as 1st Team Region XX as well as 1st Team Region XX ALL Tournament Team.



VARSITY FOOTBALL TEAM

1959

The 1959 Varsity Football Team achieved all it could during this undefeated season. Led by an excellent defense and sparked by its Single Wing Offense, the Tigers triumphed over a difficult schedule featuring 5 upper level, Class "C" teams.

All season long the Tigers' defensive fronts constantly stopped and controlled opponents' drives. This defense made multiple stands, featuring fumbles, interceptions and 4-down red zone stops.

The offense featured consistent gains early, sparked by dependable line play all season long. By mid-season, the offense began to feature long runs by its stellar backfield. The team finished second in the final Class "D" standings even though it was an undefeated season. The Cumulative Point System used to determine the standings rendered the Tigers second place in Class "D".

The team was coached by IHS Hall of Famers Elliott Roundy (Head Coach) and Bob Burke (Assistant Coach) as well as Assistant Coach William Cobbett. The captains were Peter Cooke and IHS Hall of Famer, Cameron Wallace.



GIRLS' BASKETBALL TEAM

Division III State Champions

1979-1980

The 1979-1980 Ipswich High School Girls' Basketball Team was the first girls' team in the history of IHS interscholastic athletics to win a State Championship. Several teams had knocked on the door, but this team of destiny delivered! On Saturday March 15, 1980, busses and carloads of Ipswich fans traveled 2 ½ hours to Springfield, MA to support their Tigers in the title game. Before a crowd of over 1200 spectators at American International College's Butva Gym, the Tigers claimed the Division III Basketball Championship by defeating a strong Lee team 52-42.

The Tigers were led by Tri-Captains Lisa Crocetti, Joan Clarkin and Mary Logan who led the team to a regular season record of 23-2 and a Cape Ann League Championship. A 5-0 record in the state tournament earned them a Division III North Championship and Division III State Championship and a final record of 28-2.

Over the course of the season the Tigers were persistent and persevered. When one team member went down, another stepped up. This magical season was a total team effort. These Tigers were on a mission. Previous teams had knocked on the door but just missed. The ball had been passed to them. It was time for the Tigers of 79'-80' take that last step. They accepted the challenge.

So on that glorious day in March of 1980, as the newly crowned Division III State Champions and fans traveled back to Ipswich, they were greeted and escorted into town by the Ipswich Police and driven through Ipswich by the Ipswich Fire Department. They were cheered by the townspeople of Ipswich who had supported them on their journey.

They had fulfilled their destiny!

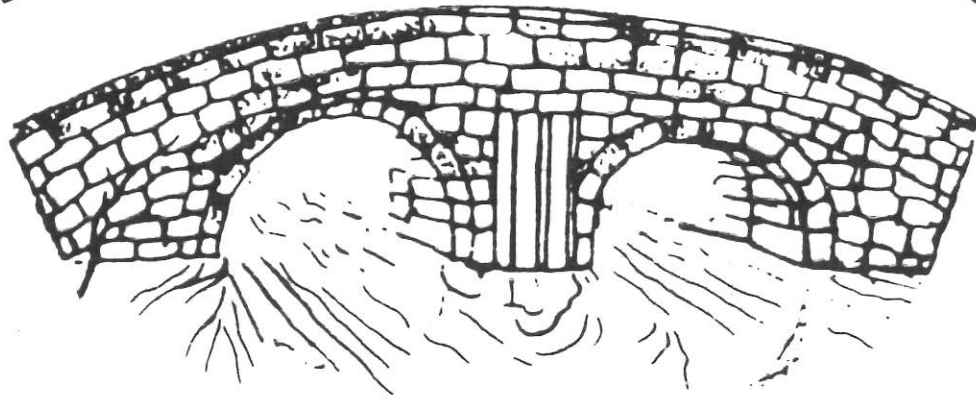

The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — ATHLETES: To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — COACHES: To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria:

They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — MERITORIOUS SERVICE: To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
