DAVID J. BIALEK

Hockey, Baseball
1966–1970

David Bialek, class of 1970, was an honor student and a three sport letterman in hockey, baseball and football.

A four year starter in hockey, David led the team in goals, assists and points in his sophomore, junior and senior years. In his sophomore year he switched from first-line center to defense so that the team could utilize his skating ability for longer periods of time, and was selected that year to the Merrimack Valley League first-team All-Star team. In his junior and senior years he went back to his natural position of center on the forward line. In his senior year he was selected to the Twin State League first-team All-Star team and was voted the league's Most Valuable Player as he led the Tigers to the championship of the league and to its first state hockey tournament. He scored 54 goals in his last 18 games at IHS. He was selected to the Salem News and Beverly Times first-team All-Star team his senior year.

David also was a four year starter in baseball, playing the outfield all four years. He led the team in hitting his junior and senior years and in home runs his senior year. He captained the baseball team in 1970 and led the Tigers to the 1970 State Tournament where he batted .538 with two home runs, three doubles, two singles and eight runs batted in.

David graduated from Dartmouth College in 1974. He attended the University of Notre Dame Law School and the Northeastern University Graduate School of Professional Accounting. He has worked for thirty years with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts at the Department of Revenue, where he is currently a senior tax appeals officer.



JOHN S. BIALEK

Hockey, Baseball, Football
1929–1933

Mr. John S. Bialek played varsity hockey and baseball for four years, serving as captain of each team. He also played football in his junior and senior years. While statistics are not available from those days, his classmates thought highly enough of him to elect him the class athlete, as well as class vice-president, for the Class of 1933.

John went on to have a stellar hockey career at Northeastern University, where he led the team in scoring for three years, and served as team captain as a senior. He was named All-League, All-New England and All-East in both his junior and senior years. Renowned for his flashy skating, he led the nation in scoring in his senior year, garnering 26 goals and 16 assists in only ten games. He also earned three varsity letters in baseball.

John had been an outstanding student at Ipswich, and continued that excellence at Northeastern, completing a five-year engineering program in only four years, and appearing on the Dean's List every semester.

Following his graduation in 1937, John continued his hockey career with the Boston Olympics, an amateur team that won the United States hockey championship.

A life-long resident of Ipswich, he gave his time and energy to the town in many ways, serving on the Board of Selectmen, School Building Needs Committee and Recreation Committee. John was a co-founder and long-time president of Ipswich Little League, and the founder and president of Ipswich Youth Hockey. Following his untimely death in 1977, town residents, in recognition of John's devotion to Ipswich, voted to name Bialek Park in his honor.

In 1980, John was inducted into the Northeastern University Hall of Fame.



CHRISTOPHER BROMBY

Lacrosse, Hockey

1989–1993

At the time of his graduation Chris Bromby was the most prolific scorer and most successful lacrosse player in school history. Although he did play four years of Varsity Hockey, Chris was never seen without a lacrosse stick in his hand. He was a wizard with the lacrosse stick!

As a junior, Chris led the state in scoring with 73 goals and 34 assists for a total of 107 points. He was named to the Eastern Massachusetts Lacrosse All Star Team, Salem Evening News All Star Team.

In his senior year, Chris was again the leading scorer in Massachusetts, while leading his team to the Eastern Mass. League Division Championship. Chris scored 55 goals, 51 assists for a total of 106 points. He was the team M.V.P. and again was named to the Eastern Mass. All Star team. He was also a Salem News All Star and Boston Globe and Boston Herald All Scholastic.

Chris was a Bay State Gold Medal Champion in 1992, 1994 and 1995. After numerous offers, Chris decided on Springfield College. Great decision, as Springfield went on to win the National Championship in his first year.

The next year he transferred to the U.N.H. where he was the leading scorer and points leader in 1996 and 1997. He was the leading goal scorer in the American East League and team Offensive M.V.P. in 1997.

His lacrosse career continued at the professional level with the Brine Lacrosse Club and was drafted by the Major League Lacrosse team, the Boston Cannons where he played for three years.

Chris is currently living in Newburyport with his wife Melissa and their two daughters Reese and Morgan. He is working as a Cardiology I.T. specialist for the North Shore Medical Center.



VENETIA (CONSTANTINE) REILLY

Field Hockey, Basketball, Track

1972–1976

Venetia (Constantine) Reilly was one of the most naturally gifted three sport athletes to graduate from IHS. Whether it was on the field hockey field, basketball court or track, Venetia was a fierce competitor and leader.

As a varsity field hockey player, Venetia was a member of the Cape Ann League championship teams of 1972 and 1973. On the basketball court Venetia is seventh on the all-time rebounding statistics averaging 9.2 rebounds per game. She was a Cape Ann League All-Star and co-captained the Cape Ann League Championship team and Division II North Championship team of 1976.

Venetia's most notable accomplishments were earned as a track star for Ipswich High School. She was a three year Boston Globe All-Scholastic; three year Class C High Jump champion; three year All-State High Jump champion; three year CAL All-Star; four year CAL High Jump champion and a Beverly Times and Salem News All-Star for three years. Venetia also ran for the Liberty Track Club. She also qualified for the National Youth Games by jumping 5'7", and placed third nationally. Venetia also competed in the National Junior Olympics and placed 5th overall.

Venetia attended Northeastern University after graduating from IHS where she played basketball and was instrumental in establishing the women's track program. After graduation from Northeastern, Venetia began work in the field of Physical Therapy. She currently co-owns and works a private physical therapy practice in NH. She continues to participate in small races and sprint triathlons. Venetia is married to Joe Reilly and has three adult children and one grandchild.



JAMES M. LAROCHELLE

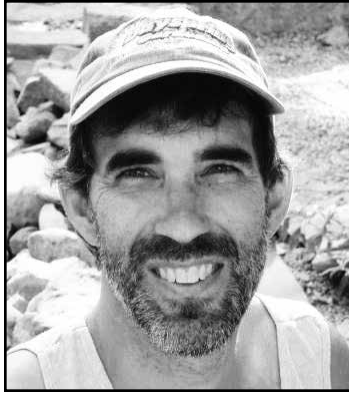
Wrestling, Football
1967-1971

The most celebrated and winning wrestler in school history, Jimmy LaRoche never lost a Cape Ann League dual meet, finishing his career with a 57-0 record. He was a two-time Cape Ann League tournament champion, in 1970 and 1971 (there was no tournament in his freshman and sophomore years). Following the CAL season it was off to the Northeastern Mass Sectional Championships where he won the championship four consecutive years from 1968 to 1971.

As a freshman, wrestling at 103 pounds, Jimmy won the Massachusetts State Championship and went on to finish as the runner up in the New England Championship. The final match finished in a 2-2 tie but wrestling rules awarded the victory to his opponent 3-2. As a sophomore, wrestling at 120 pounds, he finished 3rd in the States. A knee injury forced him out of the state tournament in his junior year but he came back as a senior to finish as the runner up.

In four years he earned one state championship, four Northeastern Mass Sectional Championships, two Cape Ann League Championships and as a senior was voted the Tigers' Outstanding Wrestler.

Jimmy also competed in A.A.U. tournaments where he won the New England Jr. AAU 17 and under championship twice and the New England Sr. AAU championship once. He finished 4th in the National AAU tournament.



JOSEPH "JJ" MILLETTE

Cross Country, Track
1982–1986

Joseph (J.J.) Millette graduated from Ipswich High School in 1986. One would be hard pressed to find an IHS runner that had achieved the level of success that J.J. had on both the cross-country and track teams.

J.J.'s achievements on the boy's cross-country team include Cape Ann League All-Star, Boston Globe All-Scholastic, Boston Herald All-Scholastic, Salem News All-Star. In 1985, he took first place in the Division II State Coaches Meet 3-mile, and 3rd place in the All-State 3.1 mile with a time of 15:55. In his senior year, J.J. was the Cape Ann League 3 mile Champion.

His accomplishments on the track team were equally impressive. In 1984, he placed 1st in the Eastern Mass. Class D 2-mile (9:33.4) and was the State Class D 2-mile Champion (9:38.5) in 1985. In 1985, J.J. was the All-State Outdoor Track & Field Champion 2-mile (9:15.36), as well as the All-New England 3200 Meter Champion (9:22.2). He graduated in 1986 having set Ipswich High School records in the 1-mile (4:21.3) and 2-mile (9:15.36).

J.J. continued to be a major contributor on the UMass cross country team. In 1988, he placed 6th in the Inter Collegiate Amateur Athletic Association Meet, and in 1989 he was named MVP. Unfortunately, in his junior year J.J. developed an injury that would effectively end his running career. He did make a brief comeback 1990 when he ran his fastest road 10K at the New England Championships. He placed 3rd in 30:17 but once again a debilitating injury caused him to hang up his running shoes for good.

J.J. and his wife Melanie live in Rowley, MA. They have 10 children, ranging in age from 10 months to 18 years. J.J. owns and operates a growing landscape business.



EDWARD SKLARZ

Baseball, Basketball, Football
1949–1953

During his four years (1949–1953) at Ipswich High School, Ed Sklarz was a three sport athlete having been awarded 12 varsity letters, four each in football, basketball, and baseball and two junior varsity letters while still in eighth grade making him a 14 time Ipswich High letterman.

Ed was a member of the Cape Ann League baseball championship team in both 1952 and 1953. He was the 1952 C.A.L. batting champion with a .483 average and also pitched a perfect game (no hits, no runs, no reach). In a “masterful performance,” Ed pitched 16 strike-outs while fielding all but one of the 5 infield grounders. During 1952 and 1953, he played for the Marbleheaders semi-pro team.

Again receiving a junior varsity letter in eighth grade, Ed continued his basketball career in high school and obtained a varsity letter each year. In 1952 he was the leading scorer (15.7 points per game) and was elected captain in his senior year. He was a C.A.L. All-Star in both 1952 and 1953 and captained the team in 1952.

Ed also played Ipswich High football and was awarded four varsity letters.

He is additionally proud of his role as Class President in 1953 and his four year athletic/academic scholarship to Tufts University (School of Engineering) leading to an engineering degree in 1957. During his freshman and sophomore years at Tufts, he was a member of the baseball team. He credits previous I.H.S. Hall of Famer and his Coach Elliot Roundy for encouragement and guidance during his formative years.



DAVID WHIPPLE

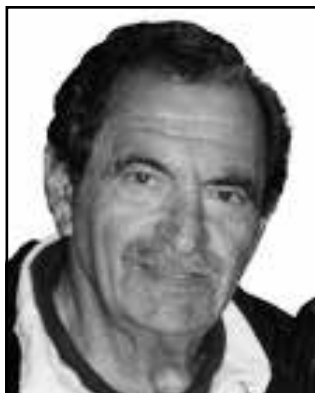
Basketball Coach

1966–1978

At the time of Dave Whipple's retirement in 1978, he was the winningest coach in Ipswich Boys' Varsity Basketball history. A Co-Captain at Ipswich High in 1954, Dave was urged to get into coaching a decade later. After spending two years as Junior Varsity Coach with a 31–6 record, Dave's successful varsity coaching career began in 1966. In Dave's first year, his team beat heavily favored North Reading and upset both Rockport and State Champion Manchester with only one player over 6'1". The late columnist Jim Daly offered his insight into Coach Whipple's immediate success: "We've got Dave Whipple on our side plus five starters who are listening to his strategy."

In 1969, Coach Whipple led his team to the Boston Garden and Ipswich's first State Championship, defeating St. Stephen's. The following year he returned to the Garden where the Tigers lost to rival Acton-Boxboro in the Class D finals. He had a State Tournament record of 18–9 with 3 Boston Garden appearances. Twice during his 12 years, his teams won more than 20 games. His teams won a total of 172 games and at one point he had a streak 33 straight wins. His continued success was attributed to adapting each year's offense and defense to the strengths and weaknesses of his players and his team. He demanded fitness, discipline and team defense. His 2-3 match-up zone was featured in a national basketball publication.

Dave vowed to only coach in Ipswich, and retired in 1978. He continues to own and operate Candlewood Golf Course. He and his wife, Bernadine, have been married for 49 years and have 2 lovely daughters, Andrea and Martha and one grandson, Nicholas.



ANGELO C. PERNA
Meritorious Service

Angelo Perna was not an Ipswich Townie born and raised but what he did in Ipswich and for Ipswich youth will live on through the ages. Angelo was an active varsity athlete in High School in New York, the U.S. Army, and in college at SUNY Cortland from where he graduated in 1964. During this time, he participated in football, soccer, baseball, lacrosse and track and field. Angelo came to Ipswich in 1968 as a physical education teacher at Ipswich High School. It was at IHS where he began his fascination and passionate association with Ipswich athletics. It was also in this place where Angie, as we all came to know him, found his outlet for his boundless energies, as an assistant football coach, varsity wrestling coach and varsity soccer coach.

Although Angie moved on to teach at the O'Malley Middle School in Gloucester, he kept his hand in Ipswich town athletics playing baseball with the Ipswich Chiefs and ice hockey with the Ipswich Hawks. He continued his playing career with the Ipswich Over 30 Softball League for many years where he also served as constant Umpire in Chief.

Angie is best known as the founder, producer, videographer, announcer and commentator for ACP Sports. He began by featuring videos featuring Ipswich High School sports during every season. He specialized in featuring the wide variety of sports available to students at Ipswich High School. Beyond producing chronicles of Ipswich athletics for viewing, Angie hoped that students trying to pursue athletic careers at the collegiate level would be able to use these videos to help them achieve a place on the teams of their choice.

Ipswich town athletics benefitted from Angie's dedication, enthusiasm, and commitment to the Youth of Ipswich. He truly was a man of all sports.

RULES FOR NOMINATIONS AND ELIGIBILITY ARE ON THE BACK PAGE

The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — *ATHLETES:* To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — *COACHES:* To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria: They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — *MERITORIOUS SERVICE:* To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
