BERNARD "BERNIE" ADELL

Football, Track 1975–1978

Bernie Adell brought fame and glory to Ipswich High School athletics in the mid 1970's. Through a combination of speed and power, Bernie helped to lead the Tigers to the Division III State Super Bowl Championship in 1977. Scoring two first half touchdowns, the team went on to earn a convincing 54–13 victory.

During his football career at IHS, Bernie scored 76 touchdowns, 462 points and had a total of 5,913 total yards. He rushed for over 100 yards in a game 19 times, and rushed for over 200 yards in a game 5 times, averaging 6.4 yards per carry in his career. Bernie was the Eastern Mass. scoring champion his junior year, scoring 146 points. He was admired and respected by both his teammates and opponents. Bernie was extremely competitive but always had a smile on his face.

Bernie earned Boston Globe and Boston Herald All Scholastic recognition in his junior and senior years. He also was selected as a Cape Ann League All Star and Salem News All Star in both years. Bernie was also mentioned in Sports Illustrated Faces in the Crowd as an athlete to watch.

In addition to excelling as a football player, Bernie was also a record holder in Track. Bernie still holds the record in the 100 meter dash with a time of 10.8 seconds, and the 200 meter dash with a time of 21.9 seconds. He earned All-Scholastic and Cape Ann League All-League recognition his senior year.

Bernie was recruited by several major Division I colleges. Legendary Ohio State Coach Woody Hayes personally recruited him. Eventually he accepted a full scholarship to the University of Notre Dame to play football. Bernard graduated from Notre Dame, class of 1982 with a B.A. in Economics. After graduation, Bernie had a try out with the New England Patriots.

Bernie currently lives in Miami, Florida working in Real Estate Finance. He and his wife Adelle are the proud parents of their daughter Khadija.



JEAN CLARKIN Basketball, Track 1979–1983

Jean Clarkin was one of the most dominant and outstanding two sport athletes at Ipswich High School. Moving to the varsity level in basketball during her freshman year, Jean remains the all-time leader in blocked shots and blocked shots per game. As a four-year track star, Jean ran the 440 with grace and speed culminating in her undefeated senior season where she captured the CAL Championship in the 440.

Jean led by example both on and off the court and field. This is best exemplified by her selection as basketball co-captain for three years and track captain for two years at Ipswich High School.

Jean's most notable accomplishments were earned as a basketball player. She was a two-time Boston Globe All-Scholastic, two-time CAL All-League, Agganis All-Star and two-time Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star. She was also twice selected as the team MVP. During Jean's basketball tenure, the team won a Massachusetts State Championship in 1980, four Division III North Championships and four CAL Championships.

As a senior in track and field, Jean dominated the 440 event going undefeated as well as being crowned the CAL Champion in this event. Jean was a CAL All-League and CAL All-Star in track. As a result of her outstanding accomplishments and leadership during her senior track season, Jean was selected as MVP.

Jean's athletic exploits did not go unnoticed. She was awarded a full basketball scholarship to Merrimack College where her success continued. While at Merrimack College, Jean was named to the All NE-8 Team, was a three time MVP and elected Captain in her junior and senior seasons. She is the all-time leader in assists and rebounding at Merrimack College. In her senior year, Jean was the first recipient of the David Rafferty Student/Athlete of the Year Award.

After graduation from Merrimack with a BS in Marketing, Jean went to work for Wellpoint Inc. She has been employed at Wellpoint Inc. for 23 years as a manager of customer care and membership support. Jean resides in North Andover.



JOAN (CLARKIN) KONUK

Basketball, Track 1977–1981

Joan (Clarkin) Konuk was an outstanding two sport athlete at Ipswich High School. Her basketball career started with a bang having been called up to the varsity basketball team during the Division III North Championship game as a freshman. The team won the game! That was the moment Joan felt like she was a part of the Ipswich Basketball tradition. Joan went on to be selected as co-captain of the basketball team her junior and senior years.

Joan's most notable accomplishments while at Ipswich High School were: She was a three-time CAL All-League, three-time CAL All-Star, and three- time Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star. She was also the recipient of the Coaches Award three years in a row. As a sophomore, the basketball team went undefeated in the regular season. Then as a junior, the team won the Division III Massachusetts State Championship in 1980.

Joan was a two-time captain of the track team, three-time winner of the coaches' award, two-time Salem News All-Star, four- time MVP and was a Boston Globe All-Scholastic in the High Jump! Joan also set the school record in the high jump at 5'6, placed 2nd in the All-State meet and won the New England Track & Field championships as a freshman. Joan also won the state coaches meet, and placed third in the all-state meet in the high jump her junior year, despite having struggled with a stress fracture in her foot. Joan was recruited by Brown University for basketball and track. Joan was the co-captain of the track team her junior and senior years. She was First Team All-Ivy in 1982, Second Team All-Ivy in 1983 in the high jump.

Joan graduated from the Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, 1987 with a Masters' Degree in Public Policy. She worked in the public sector from 1987 – 1995. Joan married Enis Konuk in 1991 and they have 3 children. Joan spends much of her time doing volunteer work, and watching her children participate in sports, music, and the arts.




CHARLES A. "CHARLIE" GIANAKAKIS

Football, Baseball, Basketball 1949–1954

The first five-time football letter winner because of his eligibility as an 8th grader, Charlie was one of the first in a line of great running backs to star at Ipswich High. A co-captain of the undefeated Class D State Champion 1953 squad, the team outscored its opponents 249–52 with Charlie setting a then school record with 135 points, good for second place in all of Essex County. Charlie's school scoring record lasted 18 years. Charlie also set a record that season by scoring 34 points in one game. Not only a fast and powerful runner, Charlie was also the team's kicker and converted on 27 out of 28 PAT's during that championship season, including 17 in a row. At the time, Hall of Fame coach Elliott Roundy called Charlie, "the best player I've ever coached." Against Lynn Trade in the final game of the undefeated season, taking a direct snap four yards deep in his own end zone, Charlie capped the scoring by zig-zagging 104 yards for the season's final touchdown.

Come spring, it was off to the diamond where Charlie was one of the region's leading pitchers. Charlie threw a school record three no-hitters on the mound for the Tigers.

After graduating from Ipswich High School, Charlie did a post graduate year at Cushing Academy where he earned letters in baseball and football. A knee injury curtailed his career at Springfield College where he was a member of the football team.



JOHN "JACK" GILLESPIE

Football, Basketball, Baseball 1953–1957

In five years (1953–1957), Jack Gillespie received 13 varsity letters. Recruited in 8th grade as a catcher for the high school baseball team, he played football, basketball, and baseball each year. Jack was a "natural" and one of the best all-time three-sport athletes at Ipswich High.

Jack was a valuable member of the Class D Championship 1954 & 1955 football teams. Coach Elliott Roundy noted that Jack was "the best all round player on our squad, absolutely fearless." In 1954, Jack was the second highest scorer. Ipswich's 22 game winning streak ended in 1956, but in that game, "Gillespie handled the kicking and passing; scored all four touchdowns and rushed for the four extra points." Jack received the AHEPA Trophy as most valuable player in 1955 and 1956 and played in the first Harry Agganis All-Star Football Classic.

Gillespie was the third highest scorer on the 1954-55 Ipswich High School basketball team. In his freshman year, his baseball team won the Cape Ann League and advanced to the state finals. Playing for the Malden City Club team Jack was considered to be "the most promising (high school) backstop in the area." He also played in the 1955 All Star Game in Waltham.

Jack received a football scholarship to the University of Arizona. As fullback, halfback, and linebacker, he was called the "Power Plus" runner by Arizona sportswriters. He received the 1960 Homecoming Trophy as Most Valuable Player, the Wildcats Tackling Award, and the Most Valuable Player in Arizona's victory over Idaho. In December, he played halfback in the 3rd Annual Copper Bowl Football Classic. "Not only was Jack Gillespie an outstanding player, he was a loyal man of great character." Jack became a teacher and coach at Hueneme High School in California. The lessons he had learned on the field and court were passed on to his students and teams. He was grateful for the support given him by his family, teammates, coaches, and community. He was married to his high school sweetheart Patricia and had two beautiful daughters, Kellie and Gigi.



PETER GORNIEWICZ Football, Basketball 1968–1971

Peter Gorniewicz was one of the greatest football players in the storied histories of both Ipswich High School (1968–1971), and Colby College (1971–1975) in Maine. His combination of speed, power and intelligence enabled him to set many season and career marks at both institutions, but the team accomplishments of each program were what he was most proud of.


In his sophomore year at Ipswich, the Tigers went undefeated outscoring their opponents 222–70, winning the State Class D title behind Peter's 1,141 rushing yards. In his junior year Peter ran for 1,170 yards and led Eastern Massachusetts in scoring with 130 points as the Tigers rolled to their second straight Class D title. His season was highlighted by a four touchdown and one conversion game against Amesbury.

Peter continued his stellar play as a senior leading the Tigers in rushing with 1,008 yards and scoring 158 points, 32 of them coming against Pentucket when he scored all the team's points in a game regarded by many as one of the greatest in school history. Peter ended his Tiger career as the school's second all-time leading scorer with 294 points.

Upon graduation from Ipswich Peter matriculated to Colby College where he was the first college division player in New England to have three straight 1,000 yard seasons while rushing for over 4,000 yards in his career. He was ECAC division II Rookie of the Year in 1971, was named to the UPI 1st team all New-England, the All-ECAC 1st team and was an AP Honorable Mention All-American.

Peter's awards were capped off when he received the prestigious Swede Nelson Sportsmanship Award in 1975. Peter's number 30 was retired by Colby.

Upon graduation from Colby, Peter entered the business world in the area of sales. He and his wife Beverly are proud parents of a daughter, Brittany Ann, and live in the Chicago area.



KEVIN NYLEN Soccer, Basketball, Lacrosse 1995–1999

The youngest Hall of Fame inductee to date, Kevin Nylen, Class of 1999, is the most successful soccer player ever to play at Ipswich High School.

As a junior captain, Kevin was team MVP and was named to the Cape Ann League All-League Team, as well as the Eastern Massachusetts Division III All-Star and the Division III Massachusetts All-State teams.

As a senior, Kevin repeated as team MVP, CAL All-League, All-Eastern Mass., and All-State team member. In addition, he was named the Cape Ann League Player of the Year. Kevin scored 13 goals and added 13 assists that season, finishing his career with a total of 62 points. However, the point totals do not begin to tell the true story of Kevin's contributions on the field. It was his versatility that made him such a force, playing wherever he was most needed during any given game.

Kevin was also an excellent basketball and lacrosse player for the Tigers. In basketball, Kevin was a team captain and starting point guard. As a senior in lacrosse, a sport he did not play until his junior year, Kevin was named All-League and All-Eastern Mass.

Kevin continued his soccer career at St. Anselm College where he was a four-time Northeast 10 All-Conference player. As a senior captain, Kevin was not only chosen the conference defender of the year, but he once again showed his versatility by leading the team in scoring. Twice named to the NSCAA All-New England Team, he capped his college career as a senior with his selection to the NSCAA All-American First Team. Kevin was named the St. Anselm Male Athlete of the Year in 2003.

Kevin continued his soccer career after college at the professional level with the Wilmington, NC Hammerheads of the USL Pro Select League from 2003-2006. Kevin was then signed by the Charleston Battery of the USL Division I League where he played from 2006-2008.

Kevin is currently on the coaching staff at Boston College.




KATHY PAGANISField Hockey, Basketball
1973–1977

Kathy Paganis is a 1977 graduate of Ipswich High School. A natural athlete who excelled in any sport in which she participated, Kathy was awarded the Ipswich High School Outstanding Female Athlete Award in her senior year.

She is most known for her accomplishments on the field hockey field and basketball court. Kathy was a three year starter on the field hockey team. She was a top vote-getter on the Cape Ann League All-Star Team and was named most valuable player her senior year. Kathy was both a Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star in 1976 and 1977, and was named to the Boston All-Scholastic team as a forward but as remarked in the Boston Globe "it would matter little what position Kathy played because she would be excellent at any of them." Her performance on the basketball court was equally impressive. She was a four-year varsity starter who was named Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star in 1976 and 1977, Cape Ann League All-League in 1976 and 1977, and Boston Globe All-Scholastic 1976. She was named MVP her junior year and was both Co-Captain and Co-MVP in her senior year.

Kathy graduated from Salem State University in 1984 with a Bachelor's Degree in Biology. Upon graduating from Salem State University she joined the Vermont State Police. In 1987 she left the state police position for a job as a driver with UPS in Vermont. She later became the operations manager of the Barre, Vermont facility, managing all aspects of the service center.

In 1994, Kathy returned to Massachusetts to pursue a career in education. She obtained a Master's Degree in Education from Cambridge College, and began a new career as an 8th grade science teacher at the Butler Middle School in Lowell. Kathy is currently a science teacher at the Greater Lowell Technical High School in Tyngsboro.



ARTHUR M. CAREY
Teacher, Coach, Athletic Director
1965–1988


Arthur Carey attended Marblehead High School where he excelled both on the playing field and in the classroom. His performance as a football player earned Arthur admission to Dartmouth College where he matriculated in the fall of 1941. During his freshman year at Dartmouth World War II erupted and, like many of his classmates, he enlisted in the Marine Reserve. Arthur was called to active duty in 1942 and remained in the Marines until his honorable discharge in 1946.

With his military obligation behind him, Arthur returned to the fields of Dartmouth and picked up where he left. During this time period he became interested in a new sport, lacrosse. His prowess on the lacrosse field led to his being named to the "Dartmouth Men's Lacrosse All-Time Roster." (1937–1950)

Arthur's career at Ipswich High School began in 1965 as a teacher and assistant football coach to Jack Welch where he served as defensive coordinator. Arthur became an integral piece of the championship football teams over the next two decades.

Arthur introduced lacrosse to Ipswich High School and it was rumored that the initial equipment was donated by Dartmouth. His success in lacrosse brought him many honors along with the respect of his peers. Arthur has long been considered the "Father of Northshore Lacrosse." Arthur remained on the lacrosse sideline for 14 years until 1981 when he was appointed Ipswich High School Athletic Director replacing his good friend Elliot Roundy. He would hold this position until his retirement in 1988.

Arthur loved every day in school. He enjoyed every sport the "Tigers" played, both boys and girls. He particularly loved a crisp autumn morning on a football field backed by multi-colored leaves, fresh paint on real grass and the sound of crashing shoulder pads. We thank you Arthur Carey for fulfilling your dream of becoming a teacher/coach.



KENNETH "KEN" SPELLMAN

Teacher, Coach 1964–Present

Ken Spellman has been a teacher and coach in the Ipswich School System for over 45 years from 1964–2011. He graduated from Gordon College in 1963 and was hired at that time as a permanent substitute teacher in the History Department. From 1964 to 1968, Ken taught and coached at the Ralph C. Whipple School.

In 1969, Ken began his teaching and coaching career at Ipswich High School. Ken was an Assistant Head Football Coach for 35 years and was part of eight League Championships and five State Championships. He also was an assistant basketball coach for ten years and was part of three League Championships and one Eastern Mass. State Championship. But Coach Spellman is best known for coaching the Ipswich High Track team.

In his career, he has coached in over 500 meets for both the winter and spring track seasons which span from 1969 to present. His teams have won three Cape Ann League Championships. Ken has been honored as the CAL Coach of the Year in 1993, 1995 and 1997; the Salem News Coach of the Year in 1994; Mass. State Track Coach of the Year in 2007; and he received the Elliott Roundy Distinguished Service Award in 2003. Ken was also instrumental in establishing the Varsity Girls Track Program in 1974. Working with several other coaches, the Girls Track Program has become highly competitive on both the League and State levels.

In May of 2010, the track at Ipswich High School was dedicated as the Ken Spellman Track and will bare his name on the track for students now and in the future to recognize his contribution to the sport at Ipswich High.

Ken Spellman would have been successful coaching any sport. He is a great motivator and teacher of fundamentals and is very proud of his athletes' accomplishments over the years. Although he no longer is head coach in the winter and spring track seasons, he continues to coach events in both seasons and shares his expertise and knowledge with both his fellow coaches and the student athletes.

Coach Spellman will always be known as Mr. Track at Ipswich High School.



JOSEPH ROGERS
Teacher, Principal

Joseph Rogers is honored for his contributions to Ipswich students and athletes for more than 50 years. Joe Rogers' lifetime has been dedicated to family, public service, education and his country. His passion for education started early and continued through his college years at Salem State and a Master's Degree from Tufts. He started in 1950 as a 5th grade teacher at Shatswell Elementary before he became a 7th grade teacher and the first Principal of the Ipswich Junior High School.

In 1960, Joe was appointed Principal of Ipswich High School. His commanding presence lasted until his retirement in 1985. He combined the street smarts of Somerville with compassion as he motivated and educated young women and men. His colleagues remarked that he was firm, fair and innovative. Joe Rogers' accomplishments are lengthy: initiating American Field Service bringing foreign exchange students to Ipswich; mainstreaming children with disabilities; embracing the METCO Program and racial diversity; creating the Advanced Placement program; and even an open campus pilot program for 3 years. He later became an instructor at the Salem State Institute of Learning in Retirement and a member of the Ipswich School Committee.

Joe Rogers was selected to the Athletic Hall of Fame because of the athletic programs he created, his rock solid support for the athletic program and his selection of faculty and coaches who reflected his dedication to the student-athletes of Ipswich. His understanding of the role of athletics in education was reflected first when he installed intramural programs between schools in the area. It continued with the introduction of Boys' Lacrosse, Boys' Soccer and Girls' tennis and hiring outstanding coaches. He stood on athletic fields in all seasons and all weather. He received the Cape Ann Distinguished Service Award in 1985 and Salem State Outstanding Educator Award in 2000.

He lives in Ipswich with his wife, Ethel. They have 3 beautiful daughters: Stephanie, Elise and Rebecca; 5 grandchildren; and, two great grandchildren. He served his country in the Navy between 1943 and 1946 including the amphibious forces in the Pacific Fleet and upon the USS El Dorado.

The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — ATHLETES: To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — **COACHES:** To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria:

They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — MERITORIOUS SERVICE: To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.

The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes up short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who, at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat.*
