NANCY (CAMPUS) FRENCH

Field Hockey, Basketball 1974–1978

Nancy (Campus) French was an outstanding athlete at Ipswich High School earning letters in field hockey, basketball and softball. She had a passion for athletics that was exemplified by her desire, dedication and leadership. Her classmates voted her Class Athlete in her senior year.

It all began at Linebrook playground for Nancy. She would go every day to participate in endless pick-up games of baseball, kickball and whiffle ball. She was also a huge Boston Bruins fan and dreamed of playing for them one day!

While at IHS, Nancy's most notable accomplishments were in field hockey and basketball. In field hockey, she was Co-Captain, MVP and was selected as an All-Star for the CAL, Beverly Times and Salem News. Her team also won a CAL Championship. In basketball, Nancy was Captain and earned the Coaches Award. In addition she was selected as an All-Star for the CAL, Beverly Times and Salem News. Nancy also was selected as an Agganis All-Star and participated in the first Agganis All-Star game. Nancy's teams also won the CAL Championship and MA State Division III North Championship.

Her high school exploits did not go unnoticed as Nancy was offered an athletic scholarship to then Mitchell Junior College in CT, where she captained the field hockey team and was named an All-American by NJCAA after winning the NJCAA National Field Hockey Tournament. After graduating from Mitchell, Nancy matriculated at Westfield State. While at Westfield, Nancy captained the field hockey team that was an NCAA Division III semifinalist. She was also selected to the NCAA All-Tournament Team.

After graduating from Westfield, Nancy spent two years coaching field hockey at Beverly High School. She also worked part time as an administrative assistant and bookkeeper while raising her two children Lyndsay and Jared. After many years of volunteering in the schools, Nancy became a Special Education Teaching Assistant at the Winthrop School where she currently works.



JOHN D. DAVIS
Baseball, Basketball, Soccer, Track and Field, Football
1979–1983

John Davis enjoyed an outstanding athletic career during his four years at Ipswich High School. In basketball, John completed 2 years of varsity, captaining the teams both years. He was named a Cape Ann League All Star in both his junior and senior year. He was the team most valuable player in his senior year averaging 17 points per game.


John also enjoyed a successful soccer career. John was the captain both his junior and senior years. Additionally he was named Cape Ann League All Star both years as well. John also competed on the varsity level in baseball both his junior and senior years, again being named captain. He was named Cape Ann League All Star both years for baseball.

In his junior year, John earned 4 varsity sport letters, competing in basketball, soccer, baseball and track and field. He competed in the high jump and triple jump and placed first in 4 out of 5 meets in which he competed earning him qualification for the Cape Ann League Championship meet.

His many athletic achievements earned him the male class athlete of the Class of 1983. After high school, John played at the University of Lowell as a walk-on for the basketball program. John has continued to contribute to Ipswich athletics volunteering to coach and mentor youth players for many years.

John has worked at the Rogers Foam Company for 29 years. He has been married to his wife Sam for 24 years. The have four daughters, Abigail, 23, Rachel, 23, Julia, 21, and Anna who is 15.

John and his family reside in Ipswich.




ROBERT E. DUDEK
Basketball, Baseball, Cross Country
1960–1964

"Dude," as he was affectionately known by everyone, was a standout at basketball and baseball, most likely because he did, indeed, stand out. Being well over six feet, he surely had the build for rebounding and making that long stretch at first base.

Bob's interests in sports, like so many Ipswich kids in the 1950s, began with playing Little League and shooting hoops in the yard, where he spent many hours practicing dribbling, shooting and rebounding. He began his high school athletic career playing JV basketball and baseball his freshman year, and for two years ran cross country for Coach McKenna. Dude soon found himself starting for the Varsity in basketball and in baseball the next three years.

Bob's sport was basketball, with his leaping ability and sharp elbows. As such, he consistently averaged 14 points per game and holds the school rebounding record. The senior co-captain led his team to the Tech Tourney, where the Tigers lost their final game by 1 point to eventual tourney winner Provincetown. He finished the year with 225 points and 200 rebounds. He was co-winner of the Teen Club Sportsmanship Award, named the Richard Pickard MVP, and was a Boston Globe third team Class D All-Scholastic team member.

Bob gave his life in the service of our country during the Vietnam War. As a lasting honor, for forty-five years, the Dudek Award has been presented to the I.H.S. basketball MVP in his memory.



BARRY "BUTCH" JOHNSON Football, Baseball, Wrestling 1964–1967

Butch arrived at Ipswich High School in the Fall of 1964. His impact on I.H.S. athletics was immediate. He joined the football team and became an immediate force as a fullback and linebacker under new Coach Jack Welch's guidance. Over 3 seasons Barry displayed a combination of speed and power as a runner and pass catcher out of Ipswich's Wing-T Offense. He made many key plays from his middle linebacker position garnering many admirable accolades from opposing coaches. His high points include 3 TD's in 1965 against Lynn Tech and a 71-yard TD run against Winnacunnet in 1966. I.H.S. Football achieved a 16-8-2 record during his career.

Barry's baseball accomplishments were equally as strong. He earned a reputation as one of the best high school power pitchers on the North Shore for 3 seasons. During those seasons he achieved a high point record of 6-0 in 1966 and threw 8 "No Hitters" over these seasons. Barry was a strikeout machine as a pitcher amassing 16 against St. Ann's High School, 14 and 13 against Masconomet, 13 against Rockport and 12 against Lynn Tech. He was scouted by 8 Major League teams including 2 powers of that era – the Baltimore Orioles and Los Angeles Dodgers. After graduating from I.H.S. Barry went on to a stellar career in the Inter-Town League and was inducted into the ITL Hall of Fame.




ELEANOR M. KNOWLES
Athlete, Coach, Meritorious
Softball, Basketball
1956–1960

Ellie Knowles has the distinction of being the first Ipswich Hall of Fame member inducted in all three categories. An exceptional athlete, she started on this path as an eighth grade student playing for the high school Varsity softball team. Once in high school, she started at first base on the Varsity team all four years, lettered in basketball her freshman, sophomore, junior and senior years, and participated in tennis, archery, and dory racing.

While at I.H.S., Ellie conducted an intramural basketball program for junior high school girls, preparing them for high school basketball. Named Female Class Athlete, she was Co-Chairman of the Sports Committee, a member of the National Honor Society and the recipient of the DAR Good Citizenship Award. Ellie then attended Gordon College, where she lettered in Varsity basketball and softball for four years, and served as assistant coach to the field hockey team.

Ellie was greatly influenced by her late sister, Janice, an excellent athlete in her own right, and her high school coach, Hall of Fame member Frances Cogswell. It was they who instilled in Ellie the love and honor of sport and the desire to promote and instill that love in the youth to follow. Ellie joined the Ipswich school system well-qualified to coach and serve as an inspiration to her young students, many of whom have become members of the Ipswich Hall of Fame, in perpetuating the values learned from her own mentors, achievements and experiences.



NICK KOKINACIS Basketball, Baseball 1953–1957


Nick Kokinacis is a 1957 graduate of Ipswich High School. Nick was an outstanding two-sport athlete earning varsity letters all four years in both basketball and baseball.

Nick was greatly influenced by his uncle and Godfather, Charlie Lampson who coached the Red Raiders and the Howe High School (Billerica) baseball and football teams. He often took Nick to his baseball games in Billerica. He recalls as a young child playing basketball by nailing a peach basket to the side of the barn and shooting hoops all day long. These experiences inspired and prepared Nick to excel on the baseball field and basketball court.

Nick played guard on the IHS varsity basketball team, and was selected a Cape Ann League All Star 3 times. He also served as team Captain in his senior year. He played in the Harry Agganis All-Star Game in 1956.

IHS baseball dominated the Cape Ann League for many years. In 1955, Nick's junior year, Ipswich was ousted from the Cape Ann League due to their power potential. The team played for State Championship titles in his junior and senior year but lost to Avon and Wayland respectively. Nick co-captained the team, along with his best friend Jack Gillespie, in their junior and senior years. Coach Bob Burke was quoted as saying Nick was the best baseball player he had ever coached. He was a tireless worker. After graduating from IHS, Nick was signed by the Washington Senators to play Double A ball as a pitcher and outfielder.

Nick and his wife Laura live in Rowley. They have two children, Christine and Peter, and two grandchildren, Alana and Rocco.



PAUL L. LEES, ESQ.Football, Hockey, Track
1974–1978

PAUL LEES – A three-sport athlete, "outstanding in Football, Ice Hockey and Track, his performances in all 3 sports were not only in the Cape Ann League, but also the State level. He was one of the most complete and diversified athletes in the Cape Ann League for decades. An excellent student."

"Outstanding character and commitment."

"A major contributor to his teams in 3 sports."

"A true leader by example."

These are high accolades for Paul as a testament to his career at I.H.S. and endorsement to his nomination to this Hall of Fame from his coaches.

Paul is well remembered for his exploits on the football team in 1976 and 1977, a fullback in 1976 and a stunning 1977 as a wing back. He received Cape Ann League All-Star honors in 1976 and 1977, 1977 Division 3 Super Bowl MVP, and Salem News Player of the week twice.

Paul was Team MVP for 2 seasons in ice hockey and a Cape Ann League Hockey All Star. As an exceptional puck-moving defenseman he led his 1977 team to the Eastern Massachusetts Quarter- and Semi-Finals in the State Tournament.

Paul was not done there. He also made his mark in track and field. He completed in low hurdles, 100-yard dash, 440-yard relay, helping to set a team CAL record as a member and as a pole vaulter.

Paul's high academic record combined with his athletic achievements are true qualifications for his selection to this year's Hall of Fame.



SUSAN (MIKEL) DONAHER Field Hockey, Basketball, Track 1986–1990

Sue Mikel Donaher was an outstanding three-sport athlete at Ipswich High School. A natural athlete who excelled in any sport in which she participated, Sue captained the field hockey, basketball and track teams and was selected as a CAL All-League and All-Star in each sport. She also was voted the MVP of each sport during her playing years at IHS.


As a field hockey player, Sue was selected as a Boston Herald All-Scholastic in her senior season. She was also selected as a Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star. As a CAL Field Hockey CAL All-Star, Sue participated in the annual All-Star game and was noticed by the coaches at Boston University who offered her a full athletic scholarship.

As a member of the "Fab Five" basketball team at IHS that qualified for the State Tournament, Sue and just four other teammates comprised the total number of players that year. During her senior year, Sue was selected as the CAL Player of the Year for her performance on the court. She was also selected as a Red Hoffman, CAL, Salem News and Beverly Times All-Star.

In track, Sue owned the Shot Put record of 36'6" for many years. She also qualified for the States in the both the low and high hurdles, shot put and 4 x 400 relay. In addition to her MVP award, Sue also earned the Coach's Award.

After graduating from IHS, Sue embarked on her four-year field hockey career at Boston University. While at BU, Sue was named NAC (North Atlantic Conference) MVP and All-Conference. She was also elected as Captain and was named BU Scholar Athlete of the Year.

After college, Sue moved to California and continued to be involved in field hockey. From California, Sue moved around both the country and the world as her husband Peter was in the military. The family now resides in Maine.



TYLER SMITH Soccer, Lacrosse 1999–2003

Tyler Smith had a storied career in soccer and lacrosse for the Tigers, as his combination of quickness, speed, power, and intelligence was demonstrated as a four year Varsity Starter in both sports.

Tyler started his soccer career as a striker and was the leading scorer for the Tigers, setting a freshman record for goals scored in a season. During his sophomore year he played both midfielder and striker and was the team's leading scorer and the fourth leading scorer in the Cape Ann League.

During his junior year the Tigers went 16-3-2, won the Cape Ann League Small Division and reached the Division III MIAA North Sectional semi-finals. Tyler was named to the Cape Ann All-League Team and was the League's second leading scorer. During his senior year the team went undefeated in the regular season (16-0-2), won the overall Cape Ann League Title and advanced to the Division III North finals. Tyler was once again named to the Cape Ann All-League Team. He finished his career with 63 goals and 36 assists. His stellar soccer career merited him soccer scholarships to both Dean College and the University of New Haven.

Tyler was also a Cape Ann League 1st team All-Star in lacrosse his junior and senior years and was an important member of the 2003 State Championship team.




DAVID C. WILLIAMS, JR. Baseball, Basketball, Football 1949–1953

Dave Williams hails from an Ipswich family well known for its many contributions over the years to their church, the community and its schools. A gifted athlete, Dave earned an unprecedented thirteen letters. While in the eighth grade, as did his cousin, fellow Inductee Eleanor Knowles, Dave earned a varsity letter. His was in baseball. He continued to play that sport throughout his high school career, earning a starting position at short stop and serving as a clutch power hitter in the lineup. He was a Cape Ann League All-Star his junior and senior years.

With his natural ability, Dave was also an excellent rebounding forward on the Varsity basketball team for four years, and, while baseball was his recognized sport, he also played Varsity football during his freshman through senior years in high school. A very popular student, he actively participated in many class activities, serving on numerous committees, not to mention being a member of the band and glee club for all four years in high school, plus the orchestra his sophomore and junior years.

Post-high school, Dave attended Springfield College, graduating in 1957. He returned to the area to raise his family with his high school sweetheart, Mary. For several years, he played baseball for the Chiefs in the ITL and was inducted into the ITL Hall of Fame in 1980. Dave passed away in October of 2014; fittingly, perhaps his greatest legacy is that he was considered a true gentleman.



D. JUSTIN WOODWORTH

Basketball, Golf 2001–2005


In the fall of 2001 Hall of Fame coach Doug Woodworth had a small dilemma about his roster. There was a freshman who he thought was the best shooter on the team. The problem was how would it look. He didn't have many freshmen on his roster and this one happened to be his son, Justin. We look back on it and wonder why Doug hesitated for even a minute. Justin was a major factor his freshman year and by the time he was a senior he was the Tigers' all-time leading scorer, finishing his career with 1,642 points.

Justin's long range shooting propelled him to earn the designation of Boston Herald All Scholastic, Salem News All Scholastic, Cape Ann League Player of the Year, the Robert Dudek Memorial MVP award three times, Cape Ann League All Star in 2003 and was All League in the CAL in 2004 and 2005. His career culminated in the Boston Garden with a state championship win over Westport.

Justin's collegiate career was equally impressive. Heading to Newport's Salve Regina University, Justin graduated in 2009 as the all-time leader in 3-point field goals and 3-point percentage as well as the all-time leader in free throw percentage. He also is the Seahawks 3rd all-time leading scorer.

Although never too far away from a basketball court, Justin found the time to golf for the Tigers and was a State Finalist in 2004. His booming drives helped him earn the Tigers' MVP award for the 2003 and 2004 season as well as being named a Cape Ann League All Star in 2003 and 2004.

Justin is considered by many to be one of the greatest shooters in both the school's and Cape Ann League's history. Justin is proud to join his father, Doug, as a member of the Ipswich High School Athletic Hall of Fame.



ROBERT F. MCKENNA

Coach 1956-1966

Coach Bob McKenna came to Ipswich fortuitously in 1956, after a storied basketball career at Salem State College. Thanks to our beloved Coach Roundy, Mr. McKenna was lured away from becoming a teacher in Gloucester and offered a teaching and coaching position in Ipswich. The rest is history. He was a proud graduate of Salem State College, a Varsity letterman in both basketball and baseball all four years, serving as captain his senior year. During that time, he was a member of three New England State College Championship teams and was named to the All-Star Team twice.

While at Ipswich, Mr. McKenna coached the then non-interscholastic track and cross-country teams, and also served as the JV baseball coach under Ipswich Hall of Fame coach Bob Burke. It's his basketball accomplishments for which he's most recognized, as his plaque attests, having two CAL championship teams, one undefeated season, gained berths in the Eastern Mass. Interscholastic Basketball Tournaments, and came one win short of the Class D title in 1964.

Coach McKenna amassed a twenty-nine-year career record of 391 wins and 161 losses. He is also a member of the inaugural Salem State College Hall of Fame for basketball and baseball, the St. John's Prep Hall of Fame for basketball and the Massachusetts Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.

Coach McKenna passed away at the age of sixty; however, his legacy of a successful coaching career and a loving family indicates that the McKenna Magic lives on.



JEAN DAUER

Meritorious

Girls' Sports Correspondent

1970s-1980s

Jean is being recognized for her substantial contribution to the Athletic program by putting girls' sports in the spotlight. She graduated from Skidmore College and obtained her master's degree from Boston University in English.

Jean was a volunteer sports writer for the local paper, The Chronicle, during the 70s and 80s where she focused on highlighting the unsung heroes of girls' sports. There was no formal girls' sports coverage at the time. She covered home and away games at both the junior and senior high school level, kept stats and highlighted the efforts and accomplishments of not only the starters but of every player on every team.

She even contacted the Boston Globe and Channel 5 for coverage, resulting in IHS girls' sports being picked up by the Salem News and Beverly Times. She also highlighted girls' sports on a local radio station.

Her Pre-Title-IX involvement was instrumental in enhancing girls' educational opportunities through their athletic endeavors. Jean also co-organized the 1st All Girls Sport Banquet at IHS.

Although Jean never drove, she always found a way to get to the games and would be seen in the stands with her pad and pen and knitting. She provided stats and background information to the HOF Committee for several nominees. Jean also co-ran a small family-owned antique bookstore and raised her 6 children in town.


All of Jean's children were involved in Ipswich sports. Jean was active in other community events and organized the first Olde Ipswich Days that is still enjoyed today.


Jean passed away at age 90 and will be remembered for the voice she gave to all girls in sports in Ipswich.





The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — ATHLETES: To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — COACHES: To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria:

They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — MERITORIOUS SERVICE: To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
